

CHERNE ACTIVITY XIOS –ISIB "XI-MER: MEASUREMENTS **OF ENVIRONMENTAL** RADIOACTIVITY"

What? You will be involved in measurements of the radioactivity in the environment. Both the artificial and natural occurrence will be studied. While the activity itself will focus on the measurement techniques, the output will also be a better understanding of our radioactive environment and a better evaluation of what can be harmful and what can be accepted. This 12 days course is a mixture of lectures, practical exercises and field trips, all in an international and

For whom? In the first place the course is intended for international students in Nuclear Technology, studying at a university that is member of the CHERNE network (see http://www.upv.es/cherne). The number of participants is limited. Elementary knowledge about radiation physics, radiation dosimetry, radiation measurement is expected from

By means of subject contents on the one hand and (subject related) didactic-pedagogic frames on the other students acquire knowledge, skills and attitudes which are essential to guide children in an optimal way.

BACHELOR OF EDUCATION: SECONDARY EDUCATION – GENERAL SUBJECTS

What? This course prepares students to teach pupils in the first and second stage of general secondary and technical education (ages 12-16). Students are trained to teach two subjects. Each student can put together his/her own course package, choosing from a range of 14 subjects. Next to these two individually chosen subjects there are some modules that concentrate on psychology and pedagogy. Due attention is also paid to cross-curricular teaching and to the more typical aspects of youth cultures. The course is practice-oriented.


